Mechanisms for submission of online/offline students' grievances

Most of the students are from the surrounding villages. On the Campus, mobiles are not allowed. Hence, on-line submission of grievances are almost nil. However, there is a link in our website to submit their grievances through on line

(Minor Grievances such as repair/maintenance issues received orally from staff or students are immediately attended – without any formal request)

Usually the Procedure is: **Class Teacher → Head of the Department → Vice-Principal → Principal.**

Depending on the nature of grievance, the grieved party can directly report to the Principal.

Category -I

90% of the grievances are attendance shortage and irregular students' cases. In such cases, the student is counseled in the presence of parents/guardian, Class teacher and Vice-Principal. The candidate is given an opportunity to come on holidays or non-working days to make up the attendance.

Category –II

Issues between the Lecturer and Student: Both are called and in most of the cases, the student is asked to bring the parent and issue is settled in parent's presence.

Category -III

Quarrel between the students due to misunderstanding or comments or mobile messages. They are usually counseled and after getting undertaking from them, allowed to continue.

Category -IV

Missing/Eloped Cases: If the parent wants Police' help, we do it. Otherwise, as per parent's request, the case is handled.
